#### Attendance

Thank you to all parents and carers for ensuring that children's attendance at WHA is among the top in the Southwest of England. This will play dividends in the long term with minimal learning time lost in preparation for GCSE and A level exams. In the short term we enter a crucial period over the next 3 weeks with Year 7,8 and 9 sitting their unit 3 multiple choice tests and Year 12 and 13 sitting mock exams.

#### **KS3** Assessment explained

Age Related Expectations builds on the assessments that you will be familiar with in Primary school.

This is a holistic judgement about where your child is in terms of meeting age related expectations at the end of this academic year. This is a prediction by teachers that takes into account MCQ results, Assessments, learning in lessons and homework.

D	Deepening	Your child has reached the year group expectation for the end of this academic year and is now deepening their knowledge and skills further.
01	On track secure (secure)	Your child is on track to meet the year group expectation for the end of this academic year.
O2	On track (insecure)	Your child is producing some work that is on track for the year group expectations at the end of this academic year, but this is not yet secure.
Y	Yet to be on track	Your child shows some potential to meet year group expectations at the end of this academic year, but is not yet on track to meet them.
А	At an earlier stage	Your child is at an earlier stage in their learning journey and is short of the year group expectation for the end of this academic year.

#### MCO

This score is a percentage score from a multiple-choice test that your child sat in the IT room under exam conditions.

These are designed to test the students' knowledge in each subject and aid the teacher with re teaching misconceptions. The next MCQs fortnight is core subjects (and MFL in Year 9) and is from 27<sup>th</sup> February 2023 – 10<sup>th</sup> March 2023.

The MCQ timetable and KOs will be shared next week with students to help them prepare.
