## **ParentPay**

Since the introduction of ParentPay at the beginning of this term, life has been made much easier (hopefully!) for all Parents & Carers – Pay360 is not missed!

Four hundred and sixty-five accounts are now active and fully functional!

There are still forty-four accounts that have yet to activated. If for any reason you are unable to access your ParentPay Account, please email <a href="mailto:finance@wha.clf.uk">finance@wha.clf.uk</a> for your account to be reset.

# **Free School Meals**

If your child is entitled to Free School Meals, there is a **daily allowance of £2.40** to spend at break and lunch times. If your child goes over this daily limit, you will need to top up your child's account.

A meal deal is £2.40 or items can be purchased separately.

Any spend over £2.40 per day would need to be paid for by the parent/carer via ParentPay.

Any unused free school meals balance does not carry over to the next day.

Any Student with a debt on their Parent Pay account will not be able to make a purchase of a snack or a drink at break time, but they will be able to eat at lunch time.

#### **Non-Free School Meals**

For any child who does NOT qualify for free school meals, the daily spend limit is £4.00.

Any Student with a debt on their ParentPay account will not be able to make a purchase of a snack or a drink at break time, but they will be able to eat at lunch time. This this will be limited to the £2.40 meal deal on offer.

#### New build

We frequently hear from guests, parents and visitors a genuine sense of excitement and interest as the new building in Locking Parklands takes shape. The building is now topped out and weather-proof. The 2<sup>nd</sup> floor (mainly Science) is recognisably 'nearly there', with furniture such as work benches, etc, about to be installed.

On the first floor, there's still plenty of scaffolding and work in progress, but all in accordance with the planned time lines, and we're excited to be planning more and more, from signage, to lockers, to room allocation.

#### **Parking**

The car park does get very busy, which can lead to conflict between drivers when cars are blocked in.



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This is a reminder that only the parking bays must be used for parking. The roadway through the car park must be clear to allow cars to leave and also for the use of the emergency services should they be needed.

The spaces for blue badge holders should only be used by drivers who possess this, and the blue badge must be displayed on the dashboard.

#### Uniform

Just a reminder that students are not permitted to wear leggings to school (as has always been the case since we opened), nor any other item of clothing constructed from stretch material. Should a student arrive in uniform not in accordance with our uniform policy and guidelines, we will, in the first instance, offer them an alternative from our stock in school. It is also possible that parents/carers can bring in replacement items. Whilst students are not in acceptable uniform, we do ask them to be in our Separated Learning Room, so it is in their best interests to find a quick solution and be back in lessons as quickly as possible.

If parents/carers can ensure that any clothes constructed from stretch material or lycra (such as leggings, or stretch trousers) can be replaced over the Easter break, we would be very grateful.
