Well done to the resilience and hard work of all who took part. In total 10kg of rubbish was removed from the beach.





## **Sanitary Wear**

Just in case you did not know, Reception has a supply of tampons and sanitary pads for your child to use, should they forget to bring in any supplies or run out during the day.

We do not hold any pain relief or heat packs for period pain.

Wheat bags, which can be heated by Reception in the microwave, are a useful item for your child to have in their schoolbag, along with a spare set of underwear. We are unable to issue heat packs, as these are used for injuries and the heat when activated only lasts 15 minutes.

There are Hygiene Banks in Glastonbury, Taunton and Yeovil, where you can obtain sanitary wear without charge.

Boots in The Triangle Centre, Clevedon, is a drop off point for donating sanitary wear.


