
Podcast Finalists

Ex-professional football player delivers anti-racism talk to years 7 and 8

Winterstoke Hundred Academy welcomed Leroy Rosenior MBE, a former topflight professional footballer whose career included stints at clubs such as West Ham, Fulham, Queen's Park Rangers, and Bristol City. Leroy, a leading voice in this field, is now also the Vice President and Ambassador for Show Racism the Red Card, an organisation dedicated to combatting racism and discrimination in the sporting arena.

The visit aimed to give students an understanding of the importance of equality, diversity, and inclusion, both in sports and wider society.

Leroy delivered impactful workshops to more than 300 Year 7 and 8 students about his work as an anti-racism campaigner.

Leroy's commitment to combating discrimination was recognised in 2019 when he was awarded the Member of the Order of the British Empire (MBE), a testament to his unwavering dedication to social justice.

Year 10 Mock Exams 24th June - 5th July

Year 10 students have mock examinations in most of their KS4 subjects. These exams will take place in the exam rooms at Locking Parklands and timetables have been issued to students. Revision booklets have been distributed to students in tutor time; these have a revision timetable, and revision and well-being tips to support students in their exams. Mrs. Campbell has been sending weekly revision and well-being tips on ClassCharts. Good luck with these mock exams Year 10!

Mathematics - Year 10 Mock exams

The first round of students selected to take Mathematics exams at Higher Tier have been chosen and information has been shared on Class Charts with those students and parents. It is important to recognise that as this is the first time these students will have seen a higher tier paper and as such, we need to manage expectations as to what success looks like at this point in the course.

It is widely acknowledged that to achieve a Maths grade 5 at Foundation Level GCSE, accuracy is paramount, and students must be aiming for around 80%. At Higher Tier, a Maths grade 5 can be achieved with a more modest 40%. Foundation awards grades 1-5, Higher 4-9 with grade 9 being awarded to only about 3% of all students entered. The distribution of topics covered in the exam is different depending on the tier of entry as follows:

		Higher Tier (%)
Number	25	15
Algebra	20	30
Ratio	25	20
Geometry	15	20
Probability and statistics	15	15

Please be assured that we will consider more students for Higher tier early in year 11 and any decisions about tiers of entry will be discussed with students and parents to ensure we make the decision that is right for each individual student.

Mathematics- Year 9 end of year exams

All Year 9 students will complete a past GCSE Foundation paper in an exam venue during the first fortnight after half term. This will be their first opportunity to experience a full exam set up. Research has shown that the earlier students get used to formal exam set-ups, the easier they adjust to it being the norm. They will complete 2 x 90-minute papers on different days. The first will be a non-calculator and the second will be a calculator paper. 25% of the exam will be number based and this will give us valuable information about where to focus our year 10 teaching.

We continue to support students to complete their Maths homework with 2 Maths Extra clubs detailed below:

All students are encouraged to attend to enable them to complete homework, whilst getting any support they require and a biscuit break!

Breakfast Club Update

Breakfast Club is a free provision open to all students in Key Stage 3 and 4. It is open Monday to Friday from 7:45-8:15 and is a great port of call for students to do some early morning revision before their Mock GCSEs for year 10, and DOOYAs for Key Stage 3. Mrs. Sexton will ensure pens, pencils, mind maps and other resources are available from the start of term 6.

Gypsy, Roma and Traveller Month

June marks Gypsy, Roma and Traveller month. Every year during the month of June, people are encouraged to join together and celebrate the diversity and richness that Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities bring to the UK, as well as learn about Romani history. Through celebration, education and raising awareness,

Gypsy, Roma and Traveller History Month helps to tackle prejudice, change the story, and amplify the voices of Gypsies, Roma and Travellers in wider society. This year's theme is 'What does family mean to you?' The theme focuses on the meaning of family, and the different shapes and sizes it can take. Mrs. Sexton will be leading assemblies in June and opening a competition to all students within the school to take part in, which will be announced on ClassCharts at the start of June.
