Career Tools

Career Pilot has a useful quiz that asks students pertinent questions in relation to their current qualifications, skills, experience and achievements. The quiz results then help students to identify their transferable skills and provides prompts to enable them to make a start on their personal statement. In term 5 and 6, all Year 12 students will be working with their Academic Mentor to best utilise the tools available on Career Pilot to ensure that they enter the summer holiday with a very good working draft of their personal statement, whether they intend to go to university or not.

Parent Zone

Career Pilot has a dedicated Parent Zone which covers the subjects bulleted above from a parent perspective as well as including information on financial support. It has an FAQ section for each pathway which provides useful information and relevant links.

The Parent Zone even has it's own quiz to help you feel secure in your advice to your child.
