Dear students, parents and carers,

Parent Pay



We use Parent Pay so that students can pay for food in the canteen as well as any trips that we run this year. You should have had an email that will help you log in. Please email whapost16@clf.uk if you need assistance with this.

Bursary

WHA runs a discretionary bursary scheme which is open to all students.

There are various stages of income bands that provide students with the reimbursement of funds which are paid directly into their own bank accounts.

The scheme enables students to apply for support with educational materials, travel to and from the academy, trips, resits and resources to support their learning.

A panel decides on the proportion of support awarded using a sliding scale where between 25-100% of the full costs to the student can be reimbursed.

We encourage all students to apply, and Year 13 students need to reapply for the 2024-25 academic year.
